Specific reasons as to why holds are happening, such as medication changes, topics being discussed in therapy, or visits and contact with families are examined. Once a month, all the restraint and seclusion data is discussed by the Quality Assurance Committee and factors such as length of placement, medications, and specific staff/child interactions are discussed by the committee. |
